Foreword

A project to research the history of the people and buildings of Chipping Sodbury was started by Gordon Tily, and before going to live in Scotland in 2004, he passed the result of his researches to the Sodbury Vale Family History Group. This project was taken up by Patricia Alcock who formed a small band of researchers. As a starting point they used Gordon's copy of a 1795 Map by J P Sturge, and proceeded to gather as much information as they could about names of owners and occupiers, trades and businesses visible in Chipping Sodbury over the last two hundred years.

To begin with the Team contacted many of the local residents who were asked if they had any deeds or historic information relating to their properties, and what were their memories of living in Chipping Sodbury. From the people that responded the Research Team were able to glean a lot of valuable information. In their search for further information the Team visited Gloucester and Bristol Record Offices, the National Archives at Kew and various libraries. Amongst some other important avenues of research they carried searches of census records, directories, history books and the internet.

Since the start of this project the Team has amassed a vast amount of information. Not all of this could be included in this publication however the most relevant information has been set out in date order on the pages for each property. During their researches the Team found that there were ambiguities in the source records due to vagaries of the house numbering system, which in many cases has altered over the years and also due to lack of house numbers on some of the source documents, in particular Census records and Directories and new and rebuilt properties. The Team advise that in some instances it has not been possible to untangle these ambiguities and they have presented their findings in the best logical order possible.

The Team would like to thank all those who have given freely information and who have helped to make this publication possible. Although many of the sources of information are included in this publication, it has not been possible to mention all the sources and individuals who have helped, consequently the Team apologise to those who have not been mentioned.

The Sodbury Vale Family History Group realise that there is plenty of other information that has not yet come to light but hope that in publishing the results of their Team's research to date this will assist family historians in South Gloucestershire and further a field.

t795 Map of Chipping Sodbury




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GENERAL VIEW OF THE PARADE CHIPPING SODBURY

Following the death of Winchcombe Henry Howard Hartley, Lord of the Manor of Sodbury, his Executors held an Auction Sale of property to enable the bequests in his Will to be paid. Numbers 12a and 14 were two of the properties included in the Auction and both were purchased by Alfred Charles Tily, the son of William Tily, Butcher of Old Sodbury, Born in 1856, Alfred served an apprenticeship with Martin Stinchcombe of Old Sodbury and became a successful Coachbuilder, Wheelwright, Blacksmith and Carpenter. 	Hill House has a long and interesting history dating from long before the 1795 Poor Rate Survey was taken. The earliest owner found to date was John Clarke who in 1682 sold Hill House to Arthur Walker. Later that same year it is noted as being 'The Crown Inn' with William Tily in occupation. By 1727 it passed to his widow, Elizabeth Tily. Several changes of ownership then occurred within a short period of time, these included Isabella Tily, then Rev. Francis Gold, a Vicar and Schoolmaster, who was followed by William and Walter Withers. William Withers was a Feltmaker, and owned quite a lot of property in that area. By 1790 Daniel Holborow owned Hill House and Thomas Arnold lived there as tenant. Daniel Holborow was still the owner when the 1795 Poor Rate Survey was taken but he had a new tenant, the Widow Ainstee, who lived there with three other ladies. Following owners and tenants are listed on the previous pages.	
	Used as an Inn in the 17 th century, Hill House was refaced in the mid 18 th century and given a false front to conceals its gables. Some fake windows were painted on to front to match the authentic ones. On the right hand side a 17 th century cottage was integrated into the property. During the 20 th century it was the home of several Doctors and surgeries were held there. Now a private residence, Hill House has a very interesting past and is a Listed Grade 11 building.



	The End of the Family Business in Chipping Sodbury	
23 Aug.1972 24 Aug.1972	The "Sodbury & Yate Gazette" of 29 th July 1972 reported on the front page the closure of the Hudson family Grocery and Drapery business. The family had been trading in the High Street of Chipping Sodbury ever since 1867 having been in their present premises for nearly 100 years. William Ernest Hudson's Grandfather, who was also called William, came from Dursley in 1867 and started a business as a grocer, provision merchant, boot and shoe retailer, and draper at the premises in the High Street which was once a public house known as "The Mitre". In 1880 he bought 21 High Street- a few doors up the street and the business had continued there ever since, trading as Hudson Bros., the premises being enlarged at the turn of the century to provide warehouse space which included a first floor balcony. It has been very much a family concern. It was handed down to William Ernest Hudson after his father, two uncles and aunts had run the business following the death of his grandfather and remained completely independent of any group trading interests. Throughout his business life William maintained the traditional link between proprietor and customer both in the shop and on his weekly delivery rounds in the district- the kind of personal service which many people appreciated. William had seen many changes- from the days when his grandfather delivered by horse and cart to the advent of motor transport, when market day in Chipping Sodbury presented a very busy scene "while the farmers went round the market, their wives went shopping "and the old market town was the shopping centre serving a wide rural area. High Street in the 1930's. Sweatman's bakery, with its double fronted shop and awnings, sold delicious home made bread and cakes. The horses and delivery carts went through the double doors, to the left of the shop front, and into stabling behind.

Arthur Sweatman died 1949, his wife Mary Jane 1969. Ethel Mayoh (Daughter of Emma) 1949, and Harold in 1959.

Mid 1970's

As mentioned in 23a, changes were made to the buildings that form 3 properties. At present time 2006 the archway was part of house/shop, a pathway led to Mr. Peachy's front door, and Mrs. Heddon, nee Dixon, used to live in here, next was entrance to the back of Peachy's, Tailor. He had the land behind the car-park, here he grew hazel nuts and during the war had pigs here. He had access to his shop around the back on the right of car-park. Standing in what is now a car-park, Pincotts was the building against the wall on the left, and the old wash-house was over by the wall. Gate (on far left corner)is for a path (formally Church Walk), that goes to the river Frome, the only place with direct access to the stream. Five front doors to cottages were in the yard, also an area where they washed vans by the drain.13 affidavits were needed to make up the parcel to sell, probably 9 properties Large Oak tree on left corner was planted by Gerry's brother Pip, when he was about 13 years old, about 70 years ago now it was his area of garden, in front of that was a rockery which mother used to have. Two buildings used for outside toilets, back to back, for the cottages, and an oil store were also in the

Part of the house was let out to Glos. County Land Agent, Major Brown, rest was the bake-house.

The tan house owned at one time by Harold Sweatman is now a garage repair workshop. It is down the lane at the side of Paul Tily's workplace. Large stone building, also the tank which supplied the water for the tannery, since filled in, can be seen in the yard, now used as a ramp to see under vehicles, but the stone arches of the tank are still visible. In this area you are very close to the Church. Gerry Sweatman remembers as boys 8,10,12 years old would put a white sheet over themselves and scare people in the churchyard, then run off and hide across the river in the gravel, never got caught. In a bedroom, over the archway, the whole room was decorated in ordinary postage stamps from all over the world, they scraped it all off.

A SUMMARY OF PART OF THE TALK GIVEN BY THE TEAM AT THE CHIPPING SODBURY FESTIVAL WEEK 2006

No. 28 High Street is quite a modest building compared to some of the houses at the top of the High Street. In 1841 it is where Charles Mills lived with his wife Sarah and their children, Elizabeth, Charles, Nathaniel, John, James and Lidia. The Census shows Charles was 55 and was a Tiler and Plasterer and Sarah his wife was 50, so it is possible they had been living here for sometime before 1841. From other records we know they had other children who had possibly left home at the time of this census.

During the next ten years until the 1851 census Sarah had become a widow and her son John, a plasterer, was head of the household. John had married Elizabeth and they had a daughter Harriet. James, Master Painter, had also married a girl called Elizabeth and lived on the opposite side of the High Street with their daughter Sarah. The 1861 census shows John and Elizabeth were still living at No. 28 High Street. Nathaniel Mills, a Stonemason, is living in Horse Street with his wife, also called Elizabeth, and their family. William Mills lives in Rounceval Street. The 1871 census still shows John and Elizabeth at No. 28 ,but Nathaniel's wife and two of their children live next door at No. 26. William had married Jane and they had two daughters and still lived in Rounceval Street. By 1881 Elizabeth was head of the household at No. 28. Nathaniel and his wife are still at No.26 and William and Jane are still living in Rounceval Street.

1891 sees a change at No. 28, William and Jane were now living there. Next door at No.26 Elizabeth was now a widow and was occupying 4 rooms of this property, her son James had married, his wife was also called Elizabeth and they were living in Rounceval Street. The 1901 census shows William still living at No. 28, his wife is now Lucy. Elizabeth and her daughter Sarah are still at No. 26 both employed as caretakers of the Reading Room.

Just by reading the census a picture of the Mills family emerges.



HISTORICAL BACKROUND OF THE STUB RIDINGS CHIPPING SODBURY (SOURCE MARY KING)

As a commercial centre, the inhabitants dwelt in their burgage plots – parcels of land whose outlines can still be traced today as they flank the main street running through the town, but as these tradesmen had no land to graze their beasts the Ridings became the borough's common grazing ground. The Ridings consisted of about 90 acres of pastures made up of the Mead and Stub Ridings.

The following is taken from the Three Sodburys Book.

The spring stem was the right to pasture on the Stub Ridings, one cow, or horse or five sheep from 20th May until the end of August. Anyone wanting a stem had to ask a Burgess to put their name on a list. Then at a meeting convened for the purpose each Burgess produced the list of people he would like to have a stem, and after comparing lists the recipients were decided on, a final list being handed to the Hayward. Next day he and the Under Bailiff would notify the lucky ones and collect dues of three shillings and six pence each. In those days a spring stem was worth eighteen shillings or twenty five shillings each, and when grass was scarce as much as thirty shillings was paid. The owner of the stem, if he did not want to use it himself had the right to sell it to another inhabitant but not an outsider.

The autumn stem was the right to pasture from the 1st September to December on the Mead Ridings after the crops were gathered. After that date the Ridings was common for some weeks during which any inhabitant could turn out any number of cattle or horses by paying two pence per animal. The same method was used to allocate the stems, the dues being one shilling and six pence and raising from eight shillings to fifteen shillings depending on demand.

The following extract appears in a copy of the Sodburys Book:-

Indications are that it was the usual practice to clear out the stables at the rear of the dwellings and amass the manure in the street until such time as it could be removed to the holdings on the Ridings or elsewhere. The period of grace for the removal was thirty days from the serving of the first notice to abate the nuisance.

Mr Samuel Matthews held the office of Hayward for many years until his death. His duties were many; he collected all dues paid on stems and acres, marked all the cattle and horses turned on the Ridings, impounded any stray cattle and generally supervised the Ridings. I don't know what year Mr Matthews died but my grandfather Mr John Wilkins was Hayward in the 1930's until his death in the late 1950's living in the Haywards house on the Ridings. On his death Mr A (Jack) Wilkins became Hayward until 1992, by this time it was a part tim e job employed in keeping the Ridings tidy, i.e. hedging, thistle mowing, checking boudaries, making sure the water was turned on for the animals etc. and also keeping in touch with farmers who had cattle on the Ridings and reporting any problems to them and the Town Trust.

In later years the Mead Ridings were to become the Sodbury Golf Club.
